





# 1. Download the app from the Appstore



If you already downloaded books from the website, the app will automatically download your books.

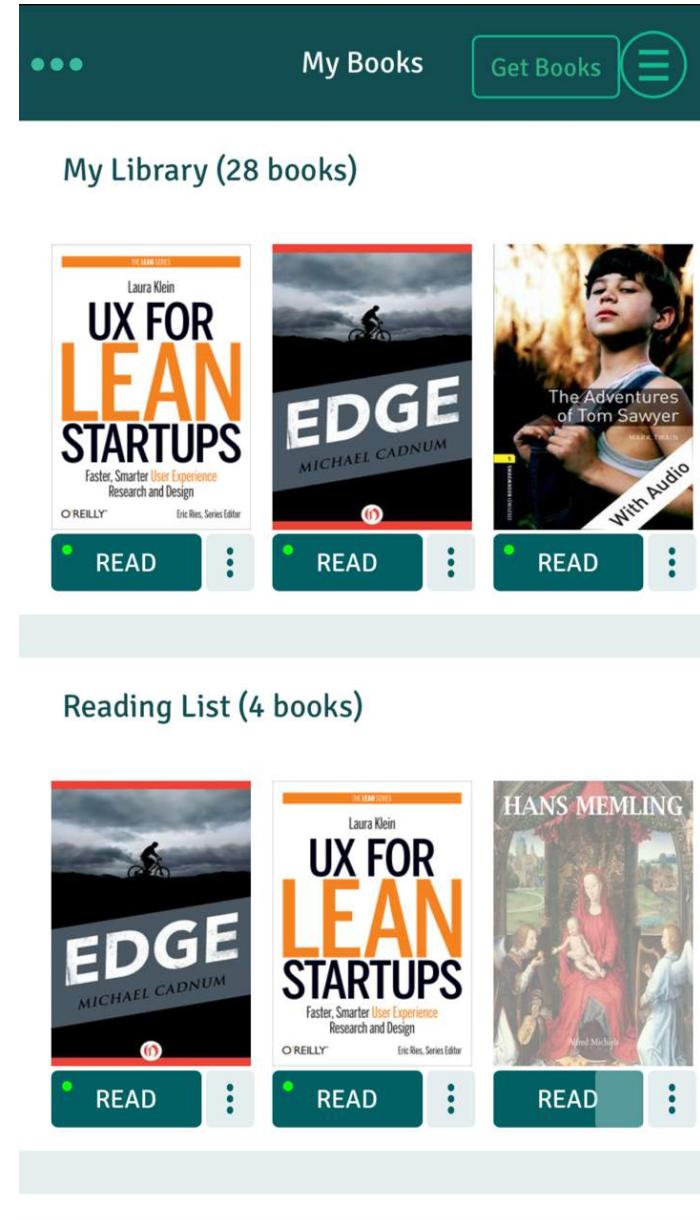
If you need assistance, click the link or contact your library.

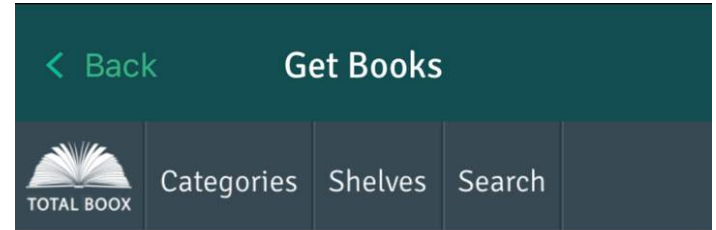
Swipe up to discover shelves,

# 3. Download books

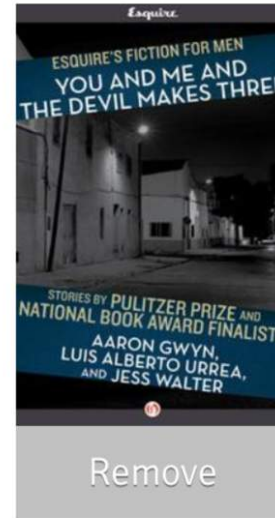
Tap “Get Books” to open the catalog. Download titles and shelves, search the catalog or a specific item.

# Download indication

When you open the app, or go back to the home page, your new books will be downloaded.

(You can also pull down to refresh.)

A dark green progress bar will indicate the download status.



READ

A small green light will indicate that a new book just landed and is ready to be opened.



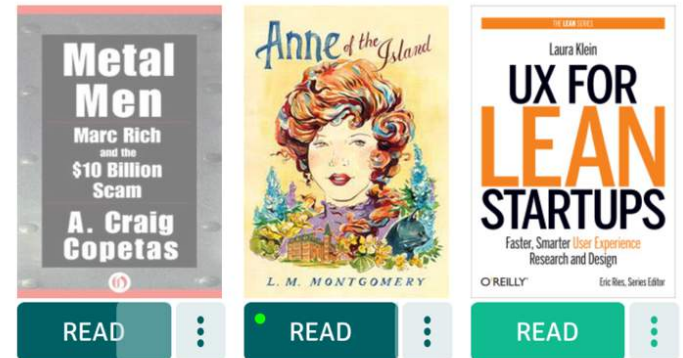
READ

When the download is completed, you will be able to tap the “read” button.

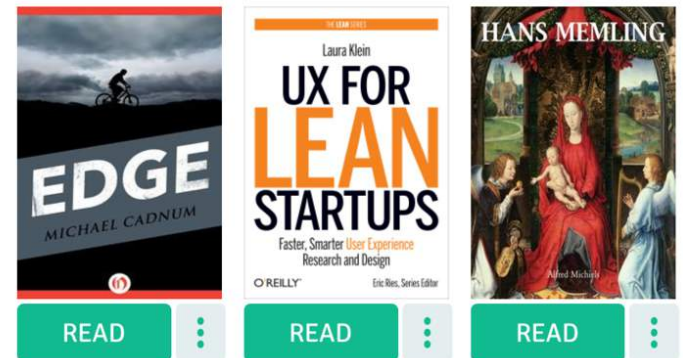
**Note that some shelves or books may take longer to download.**

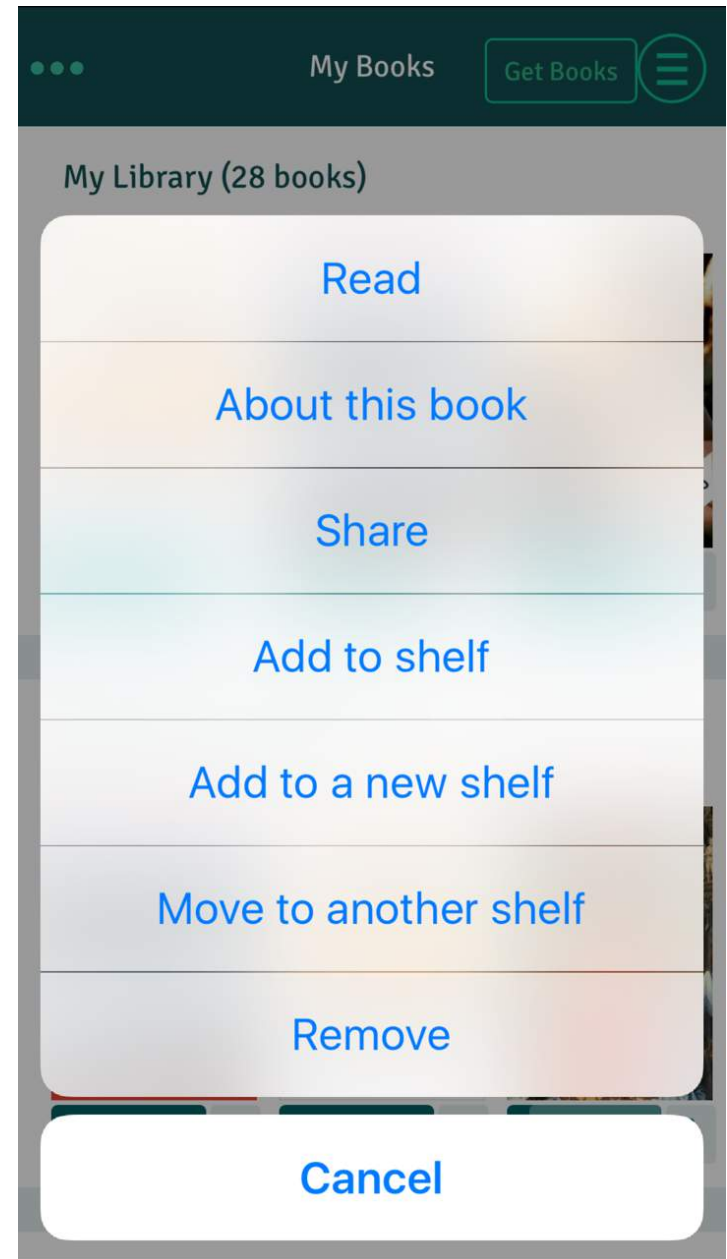


# Views and functions

In the home page, tap  to shift to list view,  
To add and edit shelves.

Tap  to manage your titles: get info, share, add or copy to a shelf, remove from your collection.

Note that you cannot remove books from shelves created by another user.



# List view

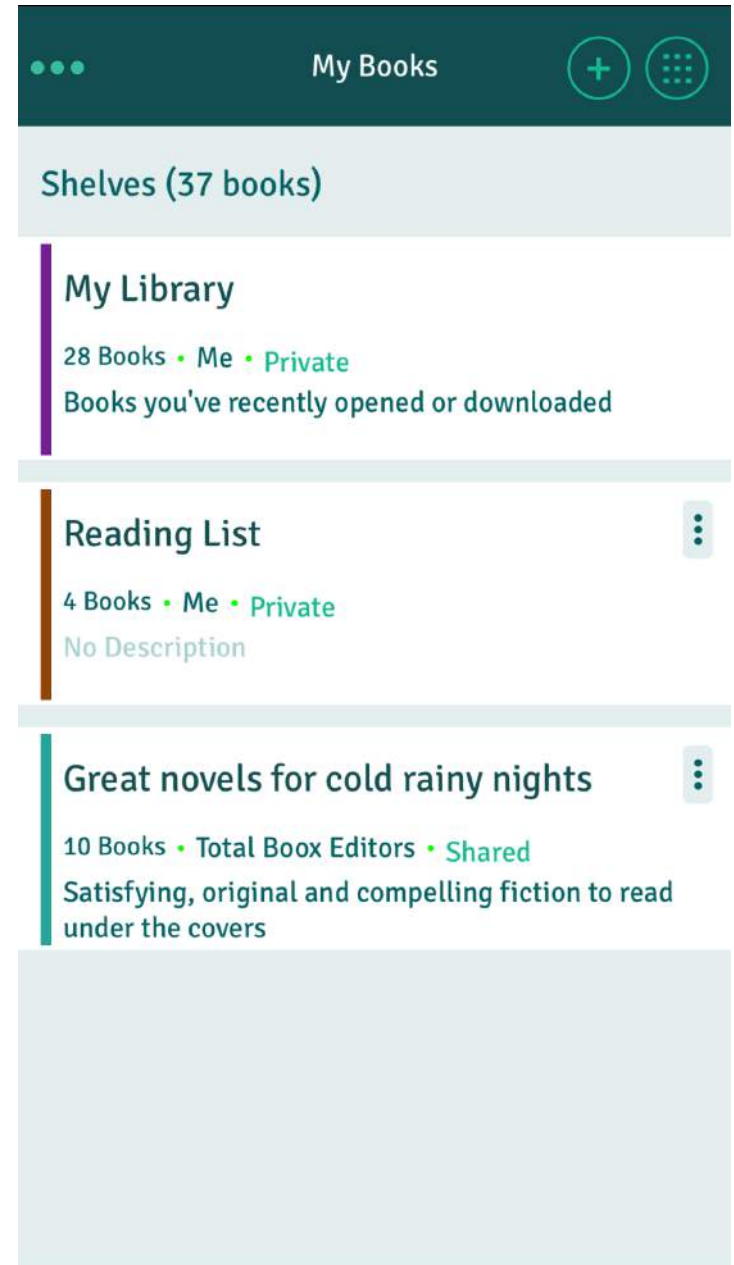
Tap  to add a new shelf.

Tap  to edit a shelf.

You can **change the name and the description** of a shelf created by you, delete it or make it **public / private**.


You can **remove** a shelf created by another user (but cannot edit it).

Tap  back to gallery view.

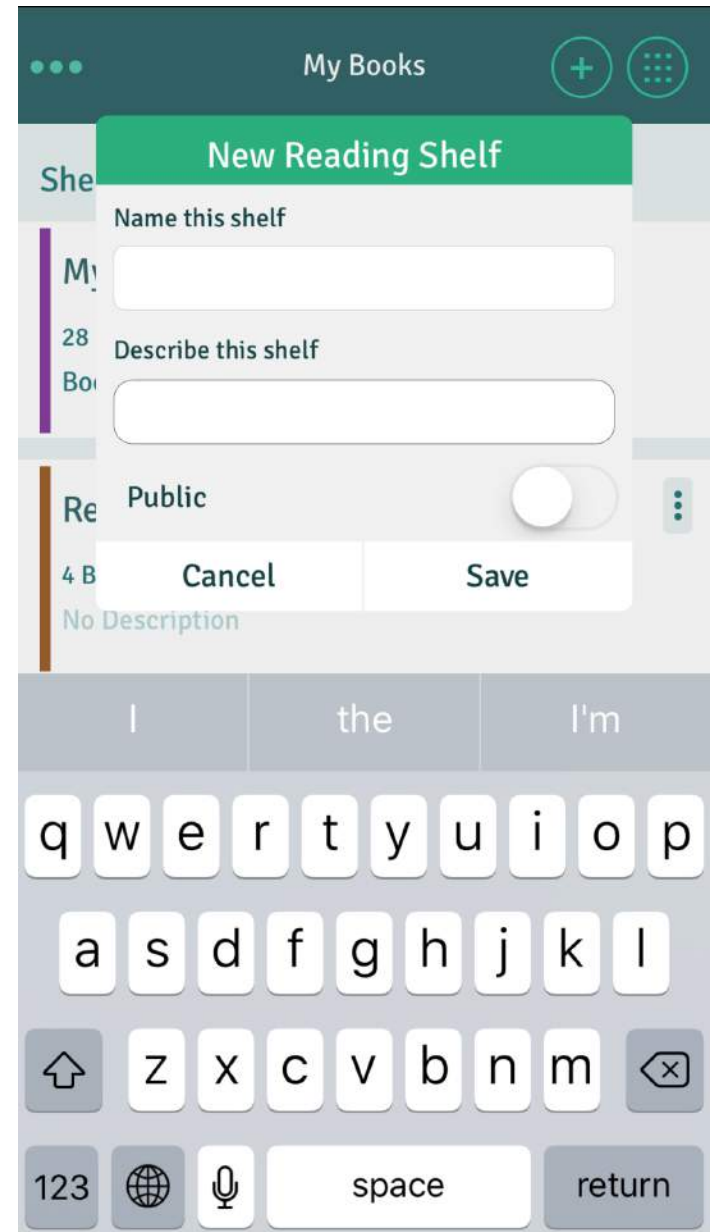




# Add a shelf

You may create a shelf by tapping  in the the list view, or by choosing “add to a new shelf” from the action bar.

As a default, the shelf will be private. Switch to public if you wish to share this shelf on our website.



# While reading,

tap the screen to access the toolbar or long tap a word to select a text to highlight it.

Tap the 1<sup>st</sup> icon to **get back to your library**.

Tap the 2<sup>nd</sup> icon to browse **table of contents, bookmarks and highlights**.

Tap the 3<sup>rd</sup> icon to **change the background** (choose from day, night, sepia and mint), **set the font size, and the screen light**.

Tap the 4<sup>th</sup> icon to **add a bookmark**.

Tap the 5<sup>th</sup> icon to read about the book, share or add it to a shelf.

Move the cursor to **skip** to another position.

Tap the **back arrow** to return to your previous position.

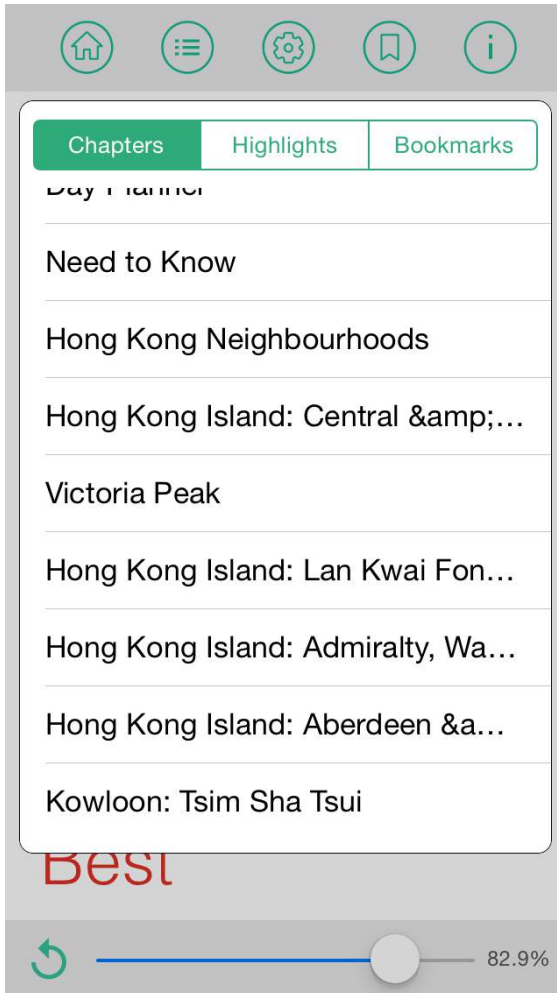

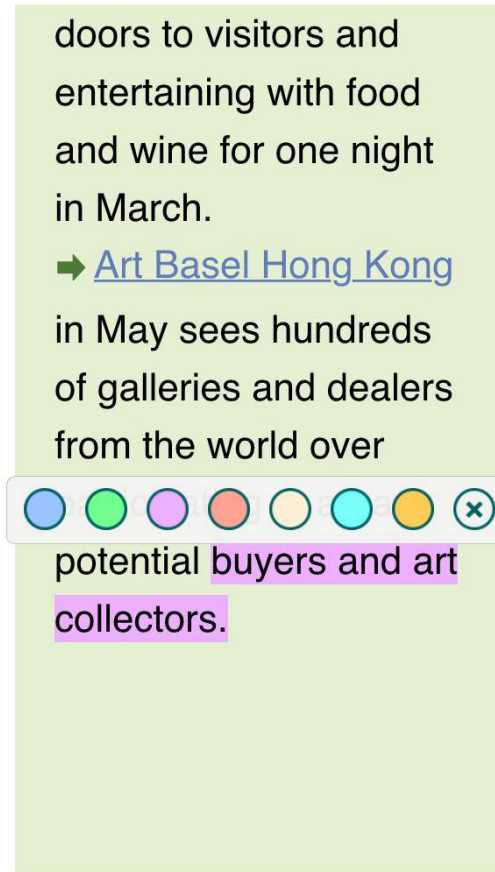
